# Message from the Chair, President and CEO

Dear Friends,

Thirty years of the USTA Foundation. Three decades. That's a long time. Over the years, our name may have changed, and our focus has become clearer, but our mission has remained the same: to impact young lives and communities through the powerful combination of tennis, life skills, and education. That's always been at the heart of everything that we do.

We know anniversaries are often a time for speeches and self-congratulatory pats on the back. But while we were thrilled to celebrate this milestone this past year, our eyes are equally focused on what's next. Tennis is awesome—we all know that. But they form only a small number of the hundreds of thousands of youth who've benefited from the USTA Foundation over the past 30 years. While they come from different places and a multitude of backgrounds, each of them has one thing in common: They've all used our great sport to enrich their lives, as well as the lives of their families and their communities. None of that would've been possible if they weren't given an opportunity and provided the tools that helped to nurture them along the way.

It's never been a more exciting time for tennis in America: Participation has grown consistently in each of the last four years nationwide, particularly among diverse communities, and we're committed to doing all we can do to help foster that momentum in the years to come. The future of tennis isn't on a gated court, with private coaches, reserved for a privileged few. 



# Court Refurbishment

In 2024, the USTA Foundation disbursed a total of \$972,841 to refurbish 88 courts to support tennis programming at 13 NJTL sites in 11 cities.

The USTA Foundation's court refurbishment efforts provide places for all youth to play, learn and grow through NJTL network programming. Continuous investment also improves community access and saves tennis facilities from being re-purposed to other sports.

This year's efforts expanded thanks to the Emirates Airline "Force for Good" program, launched during the US Open as part of Emirates' renewed multi-year partnership as the official airline of the US Open. Together, the USTA Foundation and Emirates refurbished four courts at Brooklyn's De Hostos Playground. Over the next four years, Emirates has committed to funding court refurbishment projects in parks, schools, and community centers in U.S. cities where it operates.

# Excellence Program

In 2024, the Excellence Program fostered the growth and development of 391 young tennis players nationwide, culminating with 91% of high school seniors in the program matriculating into college. The Excellence Program combines ongoing high performance training, key competition opportunities, and college preparation and recruitment support.

In June, the Wildcard Camp Playoff took place at the National Campus in Orlando. The event offered 24 NJTL participants a chance to compete in a round-robin format to win wildcards and stipends to the Junior Clay Court Championships and National Hard Courts for boys and girls in the 12s and 14s age groups. The event was open to all NJTL chapters, and players were nominated to participate through an application with their NJTL.

Taking place during the Mubadala Citi DC Open, the DC Cup Dynamic Duo, open only to Excellence Program and development team players, combined tennis matches, education, life skills training, and cultural activities. The event was an 11 under green ball event. Green balls ensure that young players develop sound technique and tactical competency before progressing. Participants from diverse backgrounds showcased their skills in singles and doubles matches, think tank sessions, and visits to the Mubadala Citi DC Open. In 2024, there were 19 Excellence Program teams nationwide, and every team had the opportunity to nominate two players, with a total of 38 players participating in the event.



# 2024 USTA FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT

During the US Open, the 2024 US Open Excellence Cup, presented by American Express and the Haber Career Excellence Program, brought together 24 student-athletes ages 15–17 in New York City for a week-long event focused on leadership, career exploration, and tennis competition.

Also in May, the USTA Foundation partnered with the Evert Academy to provide an immersive training experience for 16 aspiring young tennis players in two age groups. Focusing on eight players ages 12-14, fundamentals training emphasized technical, tactical, physical, and mental development as well as integrating NJTL coaching education, player development program implementation, and tournament scheduling. The full-time high-performance individual development experience included eight players ages 14-16 was geared to national-level tournament play and college recruitment providing guidance on long-term development and the opportunity to join the Evert Academy as a full-time student-athlete.

Funding helped support Excellence Program participants' participation in regional and national tournaments, including the ATA National Championships, Junior Orange Bowl, and USTA National Clay Court Championships.



# Frances Tiafoe Fund



The USTA Foundation's Frances Tiafoe Fund continued to thrive in 2024, as six deserving student-athletes from five NJTL chapters across the country were awarded the first-ever Individual Player Grants from the Fund.

The six athletes hailed from NJTL chapters in California, Georgia, Maryland, New York and Texas, and were awarded \$40,000 from Tiafoe's eponymous philanthropic fund by the USTA Foundation.

The two-time US Open semifinalist and former Top 10 player even surprised the recipients on a Zoom call to deliver the news in person.

"I've always had huge aspirations of paying it forward and to be able to be in this position," Tiafoe said. "To be able to be in this seat now, and see you guys aspire to be not only better athletes but people, it's a real win for me in this thing we call life. It's an honor to be able to do this, and hopefully, you guys will be able to excel with what I've been able to give."

The Frances Tiafoe Fund contributed \$155,000 to USTAF projects in 2024, including \$40,000 in individual grants, \$75,000 in team grants to NJTL chapters, and \$40,000 in scholarships to help players prepare for college.

"We are incredibly proud of these student-athletes and their commitment to their education and the sport of tennis," USTA Foundation CEO Ginny Ehrlich said. "They were selected not only for their on-court talent but also their ability to balance their competitive tennis schedules with strong academic performance. We're confident they will continue to excel and accomplish great things on and off the court."

# Scholarship Highlights



### NOVO NORDISK DONNELLY SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS VISIT US OPEN

The annual Novo Nordisk Donnelly Scholarship program provided scholarships to 14 student-athletes who have dealt with the impact of diabetes in their lives. Applicants answered an essay question about how diabetes has affected their lives.

The two recipients of the 2024 national scholarships were Spencer K. of Yukon, Okla. and Lourdes L. of Clemmons, N.C. who each received grants of \$10,000 towards their college education and a trip to New York City during the US Open. Spencer is attending John Brown University studying Economics, and Lourdes is studying Biophysics at Wake Forest University.

Twelve additional students each received \$5,000 a Novo Nordisk Donnelly Scholarship to pursue their education.

Billie Jean King presented Spencer and Lourdes (shown above, third and fourth from the right) with their awards and invited them to join her in her suite at the US Open for a fun-filled day of tennis.

# Individual Player & Player Development Grants

A total of \$450,250 was awarded in 2024 in Individual Player Grants supporting youth from under-resourced communities and Player Development Grants for high-level American players who are striving to transition into collegiate and/or professional tennis.

Individual Player Grants, established under the Excellence Program, are designed to provide critical financial support for young athletes from under-resourced communities, enabling them to participate in tournaments and pursue their tennis aspirations. Twenty-two NJTL chapters received a total of \$281,250 through these grants, underscoring the program's commitment to fostering opportunities for players in need.

These grants are issued to the NJTL chapters where the players are active. NJTL staff manage the funds, ensuring they are utilized effectively, and provide a detailed accounting at the end of the one- year grant period to maintain transparency and accountability.

Twenty players received \$169,000 total in Player Development grants. These grants help offset the costs associated with travel and training—expenses that are critical for competing at a high level.

# Haber Career Excellence Program

The Haber Career Excellence Program offers young people in NJTL programs valuable insights and hands-on experience to explore and prepare for potential career paths. Through this initiative, rising NJTL Juniors and Seniors had the opportunity to discover diverse career opportunities in Washington, D.C., and New York City, gaining firsthand exposure to various industries and professional environments.

Haber Career Days took place in Washington, D.C. during the Mubadala Citi DC Open in August, and in New York City during the US Open. In the nation's capital, participants from the Mid-Atlantic, Eastern, and Middle States sections visited Senator Chuck Schumer's office and toured the United States Capitol.

Additionally, the students visited the African American History Museum and received a behind-the-scenes tour of the White House that included a meet-and-greet with White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre.

In an inspiring New York week, 24 participants networked by attending a panel at H2 Capital, visiting Meta, taking a tour of the New York Stock Exchange, and visiting the trading floor at Goldman Sachs.

The students also competed in the US Open Excellence Cup presented by American Express.



# College Pathway & Fantasy Camps

## COLLEGE PATHWAY CAMP

Designed for high potential student-athletes ages 15 to 17 who are on a college track, the College Pathway Camp at the USTA National Campus brought together 24 youth to compete using the collegiate team format with no-ad scoring and to learn more about the college recruitment process and its requirements.

The student-athletes competed in round robin singles and doubles on four teams of six players. The teams were able to decide on a team name and mascot and were coached by a member of the USTA National coaching staff.

Highlights included a presentation by the USTA Collegiate Department led by John Desdune & Scott Tibley about the recruiting process and eligibility requirements.

## FANTASY CAMP

Held concurrently to the College Pathway Camp, the USTA Foundation Tennis Fantasy Camp for adults held in the fall mirrored a high-performance player training camp environment. Participants engaged in training with video analysis, educational seminars, and drills and games with world-class pros.

Valuable coaching and insights were offered by Bob and Mike Bryan, Sam Querrey, Jimmy Arias, Murphy Jensen, Christina McHale, Nick Monroe, Irina Falconi, CiCi Bellis, Sam Riffice, Scott Williams, and others.

USTA Foundation donors also interacted with the high-level junior players participating in the College Pathway Camp at the same time. Attendees from both camps were able to network and enjoy a session of tennis together.



# Opening Night Gala

The US Open Opening Night Gala, celebrating the 30th anniversary of the USTA Foundation, raised an impressive \$2.2 million to support the USTAF mission of using tennis, education, and life skills to ensure that young people from under-resourced communities have the tools they need to achieve their full potential on and off the court.

USTA Foundation CEO Ginny Ehrlich emphasized the event's importance, saying, "This gala is about so much more than raising funds—it's about opening the door of opportunity to hundreds of thousands of young people across the country."

CNBC's Scott Wapner hosted the event, joined by honorary co-host Lin-Manuel Miranda, and with actor Mariska Hargitay and former ATP star Tommy Haas serving as honorary co-chairs.

Attracting an array of notable attendees, including Anna Wintour, Vera Wang, Daymond John, Katie Couric, Misty Copeland, Alec Baldwin, and Monica Seles, the gala showcased the impressive history of the organization recognizing key contributors USTAF founder and former president Judy Levering, NJTL founders Charlie Pasarell and Arthur Ashe, represented by his widow Jeanne Ashe.

The evening's highlight was Chris Evert's presentation of the Serving Up Dreams Award to 2003 US Open champion Andy Roddick for his charitable work in Texas through his eponymous charity foundation.

## STARS OF THE OPEN

The Stars of the Open event during Fan Week was a benefit for the USTA Foundation. As a part of this celebration, more than 100 NJTL students and coaches were hosted in the President's Suite.

### Presented by American Express & Haber Career Week

Players practiced at Sportime on Randall's Island, faced off in thrilling competition, and watched US Open matches, including the women's semifinals, from suites.




