Message from the Chair, President and Chief Executive

Dear Friends,

In 2021 during the height of the pandemic, USTAF aggressively announced its most extensive fundraising campaign to date. “Rally for the Future” set a three-year goal to raise \$20 million. What was initially considered an ambitious target has now been increased by 50% to \$30 million based on the success of initial fundraising efforts. Then along came 2022, and our fundraising results continued to exceed everyone’s expectations.

The National Junior Tennis and Learning (NJTL) network has served communities for over 50 years. Today, doors are open to children nationwide at nearly 300 chapters, with our stated goal to increase the number of NJTL chapters by 200 over the next five years to reach a projected 500,000 student-athletes whose lives will be changed forever. USTAF rigorously tracks results with an annual survey administered through the NJTL network which shows that 93% of the youth in our programs report that tennis brings out their strengths, 84% put more effort into their schoolwork, 97% have a sense of pride about their accomplishments in the program, and 91% feel supported with setting goals.

To ensure success in high school and to prepare NJTL participants for college, USTAF has developed its signature Academic Creative Engagement (A.C.E.) curriculum. Importantly, USTAF also invests in securing student-athletes futures through its College Scholarship program, which in 2022 awarded \$435,000 in grants to 46 college-bound NJTL graduates. Our research shows that 90% of our scholarship recipients attend college for four years.

USTAF’s results only reinforce the need to continue growing the NJTL network for future generations of eager participants. We are grateful for your support and look forward to continuing to see positive outcomes across the nation for the next generation of deserving youth.

USTAF Board Members Recognized

ESPN SALUTES EVERT WITH STUART SCOTT ENSPIRE AWARD

USTAF Chair and 18-time Grand Slam champion Chris Evert was honored by ESPN during the Sports Humanitarian Awards as a recipient of the prestigious Stuart Scott ENSPIRE Award. Evert, who was diagnosed with stage 1 ovarian cancer in January, was honored for her efforts to raise awareness for women's health and for her fundraising efforts on behalf of USTAF.



The eighth Sports Humanitarian Awards, which are presented during the ESPYs, honored athletes, teams, and other industry professionals who have used sports to make a positive difference in communities around the world. Evert was one of three honorees, joining Steve Gleason, a former NFL player suffering from ALS, and Dikembe Mutombo, a humanitarian champion in both the U.S. and the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Evert has overseen two USTAF fundraising campaigns supporting the NJTL network raising more than \$5 million through the 2020 Rally to Rebuild campaign and now spearheading Rally for the Future, the largest single fundraising campaign in USTAF history.

USTAF HONORS ADER AND HAWAUX WITH SERVICE AWARDS

USTAF Board Member **Richard Ader**, who has devoted countless hours towards creating tennis opportunities for others, was honored with the NJTL Founders' Service Award at the "Celebration of Community Champions" luncheon during the 2022 USTA Annual meeting in Orlando. Ader has been a major supporter of the NJTL network as the founder of the Bennington ACES, an NJTL chapter dedicated to offering tennis, fitness, nutrition, learning, and academic support for underprivileged youth in Bennington, VT. The Bennington ACES have provided more than 1,700 hours of programming to six school districts since 2016.



USTAF Advisory Board Member **Andre Hawaux** received the USTAF 2022 Outstanding Service Award at the Judy Levering Leadership Initiative cocktail reception held during the USTA Annual meeting in March. The award is given to an individual who embodies the values of dedicated service to help advance the USTAF mission and NJTL network which Hawaux most recently exemplified by completing a 3,000-mile coast-to-coast bike ride across the United States during which he raised \$40,000 for the USTA Foundation.



USTAF in the News

FORBES MAGAZINE CREDITS USTA FOUNDATION

In 2022, *Forbes Magazine* writer Bruce Lee featured the work the USTA Foundation (USTAF) has done to bring tennis to under-represented communities.

In the article, Lee quoted USTAF Chief Executive Dan Faber: “Tennis can keep kids active and engaged. Close to 14 million youth live in poverty. Close to 75% of crimes are committed by high school dropouts. There is also the childhood obesity issue. These are things that the USTA Foundation can focus on.”

Lee pointed out that one of the backbones of increasing tennis participation has been the USTAF’s NJTL network. Despite the pandemic affecting many outcomes across society, according to Faber, “no NJTL chapters closed their doors since the beginning of the pandemic and 35 new chapter affiliates were added [in 2021].”

“The NJTL chapters have incorporated general educational and preparation for life programs into their tennis instruction as well,” continued Faber. “Their work centers around preparing youth for their next steps in life.”

Speaking of next steps, Lee addressed another USTAF initiative focusing on connecting youth closer to the world of higher education. During 2021 via the USTA’s Collegiate Community Hub programs, the USTAF partnered various NJTL chapters with 12 universities, including Michigan State University, University of Arizona, University of South Carolina, University of Alabama, and St. Thomas University, to allow the NJTL programs to access the universities’ facilities for their programming. In turn, youth could get earlier exposure to collegiate settings and college students, faculty, and coaches. Of course, going to college requires money, and in 2021, the USTA Foundation stepped up to award over \$441,000 in college scholarships to 47 students.

Lee also highlighted USTA Foundation fundraising for Lulu’s Place, a 25,000 square-foot athletic and learning center to be built on 87 acres of land in the heart of Los Angeles.



USTAF NJTL Chapter in the News

KELLY CLARKSON SHOW FEATURES DORIS OBIH & 40 LOVE FOUNDATION

The inspiring story of Doris Obih was profiled in-depth during an 11-minute segment on the Kelly Clarkson Show which was documented by Matt Fitzgerald on Tennis.com.

When Doris Obih grew up in inner-city Los Angeles, she loved tennis. Her family didn't have the financial means to support this passion, but a program called Hope For Kids opened a door by funding costs like instruction, equipment and tournament fees.

Its impact was strong enough to inspire Obih to recreate the model with the 40 Love Foundation, an NJTL chapter in Inglewood, CA. Obih wanted to ensure that other kids had the same outlet at their fingertips.

Launched in 2016, Obih and her team have afforded more than 800 children the chance to pick up a racquet and play. For just \$35 a month, kids who show an interest in pursuing tennis receive 10 sessions. Scholarships are available to those in need, and free equipment is available.

Featured on Clarkson's "Rad Human" segment, Obih's outlook on life shone through when she explained the metaphor behind her foundation.

"It just depends on how you view life. Do you view life that you're up 40-Love? Are things going your way? Do you keep it pushing? Do you fight, fight, fight and just keep on going?," she said. "Or, do you look at life when you're down Love-40? When things don't go your way, do you just stop and give up or fight to get back in a game and win?" Responded Clarkson, "I think that's the difference between a victim and a survivor."

The initiative, spurred on in its early years through donations and a partnership with the USTA Foundation, is a true full-circle moment for Obih. One of the instructors she connected with while participating in Hope For Kids took up her offer on returning to Edward Vincent Jr. Park for this reboot. Shared Terry Davis, "It was a Godsend to go back into an area where I grew up at. She was a tough little girl. Just a lot of fire, a lot of determination."



Chase Return The Serve Fun Day Returns

After a two-year absence due to COVID-19, more than 1,000 youth participated in the “Chase Return the Serve Fun Day” which resumed with a celebration of the NJTL chapters in Los Angeles, Chicago, New York, Houston and Washington, DC. Each event included tennis, educational and financial literacy activities followed by a healthy lunch for the players and their families.

Since 2012, Chase has awarded more than \$2 million to NJTL chapters including 29 chapters in 2022 serving more than 21,000 under-resourced youth. The following NJTL chapters received a total of \$215,000 in grants:

Jersey Mike's Raises \$4 Million for USTAF NJTL Network



USTAF and Jersey Mike's teamed up to raise \$4 million to support under-resourced youth during a two-day weekend of giving on September 10-11, 2022. Jersey Mike's donated 20 percent of all sales at the company's more than 2,300 locations nationwide to be directed to the USTAF Rally for the Future campaign to support the NJTL network.

To build awareness for the fundraiser, Jersey Mike's ran a national TV ad featuring USTAF Chair Chris Evert and Jersey Mike's founder and CEO Peter Cancro. The broadcast spot aired during the two weeks leading up to the fundraiser.

In conjunction with the fundraiser, NJTL chapters in 20 markets hosted Community Play Days offering tennis programming and a Jersey Mike's lunch for all youth participants.

"We are grateful for the generosity of Jersey Mike's fundraising efforts and their belief in the USTA Foundation's mission and the difference we can make together in the lives of children," said USTAF Chief Executive Dan Faber.

Evert and Faber were joined by other members of the USTAF leadership to celebrate the fundraiser's success at the inaugural USTA Foundation Impact Conference, an event designed to support the programming and administrative initiatives of NJTL leaders. The first-of-its-kind event brought together more than 150 leaders from NJTL chapters from across the country to the USTA National Campus in Orlando, FL for workshops, lectures, consultations and mentorship and networking opportunities.

Since 2019, Jersey Mike's has raised more than \$8 million to support the NJTL network.

ATA & USTA EASTERN PARTNER AT WEST POINT

USTA Eastern and the American Tennis Association (ATA) partnered to host the **2022 ATA NJTL Eastern Cup**, an empowering event focused on team tennis competition and education for youth based in the Eastern Section.

After competing in tennis-themed activities—including a relay race while balancing a ball on a racquet—the youth enjoyed a tour of the U.S. Military Academy campus, and military pilot Rumeal Lewis spoke to the students about his experiences in the sport.

Growing up, Lewis refined his tennis skills with the 15-LOVE NJTL—one of the NJTL chapters in attendance at the Cup. He played varsity tennis for four years in high school and would go on to graduate from West Point in 2012. Today, as an aviation officer with the U.S. Army, he has traveled all over the world, completing a one-year tour in South Korea in 2017 and conducting operations in Germany, Poland, England and Belgium.

Katrina Adams, former professional tennis player, Past President of the USTA, also addressed the youth at the event.

The New York Junior Tennis & Learning (NYJTL) team headquartered in the Bronx with programs operating in all five NYC boroughs earned the most points and took home the ATA NJTL Eastern Cup trophy.

Youth-led NJTL Impacting Tennis in Ohio

There is an old saying in Dublin, Ohio that has come to relate to the tennis community there:

“... A child shall lead them.”

The Dublin Tennis Outreach Program (Dublin TOP) is a USTA NJTL chapter that has been operating for the past three years. While similar to the hundreds of NJTL-chartered organizations, Dublin TOP is unique in a certain way: its coaches are exclusively high school-aged volunteers.

Dublin TOP was founded in 2019 by William Sun, and it has since grown to have nearly a dozen students on its leadership board. Those students guide the tennis development of children in kindergarten through fifth grade, both in Dublin and the surrounding communities. Sun got the idea for Dublin TOP when he was competing for Dublin Coffman High School and met students from other schools who had fewer chances to play tennis before becoming teenagers.



“I just realized that at that school that they didn’t really have the opportunities that we usually had, especially at a place like Dublin,” Sun recently recalled to [usta.com](#). “I just had a conversation with one of them, and they were describing to me how opportunities there as a kid playing tennis where they grew up weren’t the highest. ...I think that really planted a seed.”

Sun started with free tennis lessons tacked on to a free-lunch summer program for “five or six” kids; Dublin Bridges, a local nonprofit, gave Sun the funds to purchase racquets and red foam balls for the students to use. Despite the small crowd, it was a hit with both the pupils and teacher.

Dublin TOP grew exponentially from there. Sun registered the organization as a 501(c)(3), which allowed it to use the city’s outdoor public tennis courts. He later coordinated a similar partnership with the Racquet Club of Columbus—where he himself first took tennis lessons—to use its indoor courts.

As the organization grew, more students joined in and are also benefiting. Dublin TOP student leaders laud the growth of not just the youth tennis players, but also the volunteers.

“Because of how sustainable it is, because it’s high school-oriented, I think that’s what really makes this organization so special,” Sun said. “... I want to look back on this. I want to be able to see Dublin TOP is still thriving, still sustainable, still being run by high schoolers. I want to see it as an opportunity for all these kids. And I do believe it will happen.”

USTAF College Scholarship Program

In 2022, USTAF awarded \$410,000 in scholarship assistance to 46 graduating high school student-athletes as they begin their higher education.

USTAF provides financial support annually to youth who require financial assistance for college enrollment. Criteria for successful applications include participation in USTAF and other organized youth tennis programs, high academic achievement, and engagement in their communities.

COLLEGE PATHWAY CAMP MOTIVATES PARTICIPANTS

At the USTA National Campus, Excellence Program participants in the annual USTAF Excellence Program College Pathway Camp. The 2022 camp featured the Excellence Program's rising stars who mingled with the USTAF Tennis Fantasy Camp participants and Bob and Mike Bryan and received specialized instruction from tennis legends Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario and her brother Emilio Sanchez.



EXCELLENCE PROGRAM GIRLS' TEAM SPONSORED BY ATHLETA

A welcome development for girls' and women's tennis occurred in 2022 when women's performance-lifestyle brand Athleta signed on as an official sponsor of the USTAF Girls' Excellence Team.

Excellence Program athletes participate in NJTL tennis and education programs nationwide and are selected for the Excellence program based on criteria including their level of tennis ability, educational outcomes and commitment to the pathway to become student-athletes at the collegiate and professional levels.



Athleta's organizational mission is to empower women and girls to reach their limitless potential. With more than 22.6 million people taking to tennis courts around the country, this new sponsorship represents an opportunity to capitalize on the significant growth of tennis and provide additional touchpoints between the Athleta brand and the USTA's growing member base. The goal of the three-year agreement to sponsor the Girls' Excellence Team is to empower girls and women to reach new audiences of active tennis players. Athleta's support of the USTAF Girls' Excellence Program as they train for future greatness will ensure outstanding performance.

NJTL Siblings Achieve Success

Two teenagers from the same NJTL chapter in Silver Spring, MD had a standout 2022 – and they are from the same family! Clervie and Carel Ngounoue, from the Metropolitan Tennis and Education Group (MTEG) and participants in the USTA's Excellence Program, maintained their family tradition by dominating in tournaments around the world. Their older sister Malkia Ngounoue is a star at the University of Kansas.

In just her fourth Grand Slam event, Clervie Ngounoue became a major champion with partner Diana Shnaider to claim victory in the Junior Girls' Doubles event at the Australian Open. Clervie also led the way for the US team at the 2022 Junior Billie Jean King Cup Finals in Turkey. Clervie went undefeated in her seven completed matches and lost just one set between singles and doubles. In a 3-0 win over Germany in the quarterfinals, Ngounoue came from a set down to beat Sonja Zhiyenbayeva 4-6, 6-3, 6-1 and clinch that tie, before sealing the title victory against the Czech Republic.

While Clervie was celebrating her victory in Melbourne, her 13-year-old brother Carel reached the singles final at Les Petits As in France, matching the achievements of some of the greatest names in the game. Carel finished as the Doubles Champion and the singles runner-up.

Carel also reached the finals in the Boys' Division in the inaugural Under-14 Wimbledon event in 2022. Sixteen boys and 16 girls were selected from 20 different countries to compete in this new Wimbledon event, which was played in a round-robin format with knockout semifinals and a consolation draw. Carel did not lose in his round robin group, beating players from Australia, Brazil and Jordan with the loss of just six games in three sets. He also came from a set down to defeat Romania's Matei Todoran in the semifinals, 3-6, 6-4, [11-9] as he advanced to the final before losing in a hard-fought championship match.



Out and About with USTAF



Without an ATP or WTA professional tournament in Los Angeles around which to rally, USTAF supporters and Board members headed off to the Genesis Open at Riviera Country Club in February to watch world class golf, meet Tiger Woods, and get the latest updates about Lulu's Place.

Lulu's Place, formerly known as the Carol Kimmelman Athletic and Academic Campus, is a world-class athletic and academic center to be built in Westchester (near the Los Angeles International Airport) which will be dedicated to serving youth ages 5-18 representing the diverse Los Angeles community.

Launched with a gift of \$40 million by USTAF Advisory Board member Doug Kimmelman in memory of his late wife Carol (also known as Lulu), Lulu's Place is scheduled to break ground in 2023 for completion in 2025. Plans currently include 24 tennis courts, plus one soccer and one multi-purpose field, and a state-of-the-art academic center with classrooms for after school support.

The project has caught the attention of Woods, whose TGR Foundation provides academic support and which has been engaged to oversee the educational programs at the center.

The next stops for USTAF Board members and supporters on the move was Florida. USTAF Board members and staff visited the Miami area to educate and inform potential donors about the impact of bringing free tennis and education programs to under-resourced youth through USTAF's South Florida Youth Tennis Initiative.

Among the well-received activities were:

- A day at the Boca Raton Resort where Tommy Paul and Luke Jensen hosted a youth clinic and played with guests followed by a reception.
- A morning at Indian Creek Country Club where guests hit with the Bryan Brothers.
- During the Miami Open in March, Doug Kimmelman hosted a reception at his home and presented USTAF plans for programs and activities similar to Lulu's Place.
- Invited guests enjoyed tennis action at the Miami Open with 14-time Grand Slam champion Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario and USTAF staff and Board members.
- In Ft. Lauderdale, Sánchez-Vicario joined guests for brunch and afternoon tennis.

In September, the fourth annual Raise a Racquet event served as the kickoff party for the 2022 USTAF Pro-Am at the US Open. 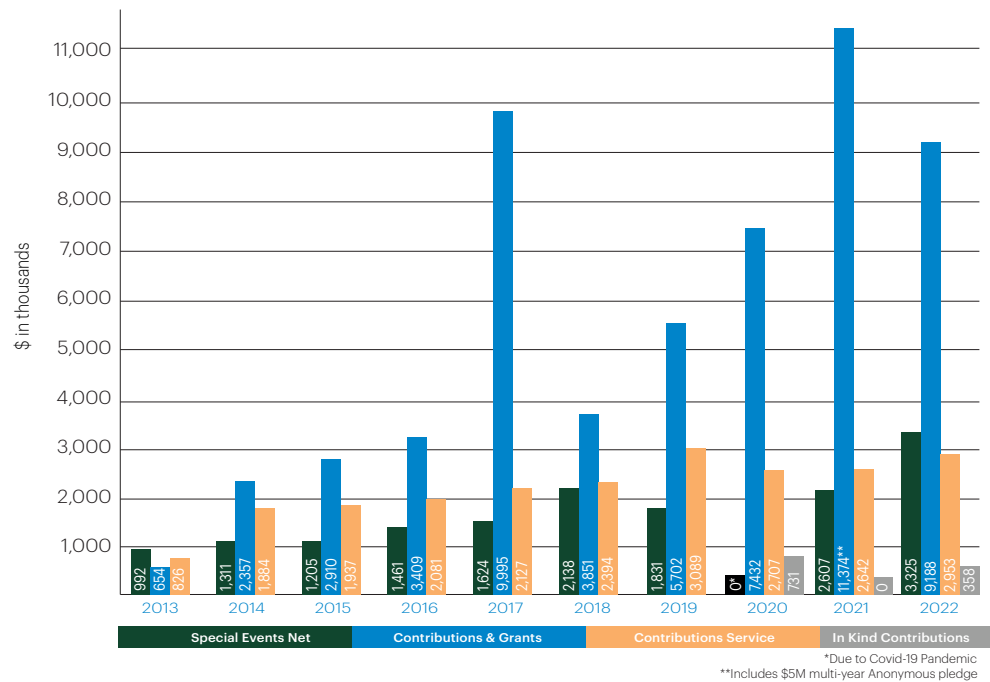

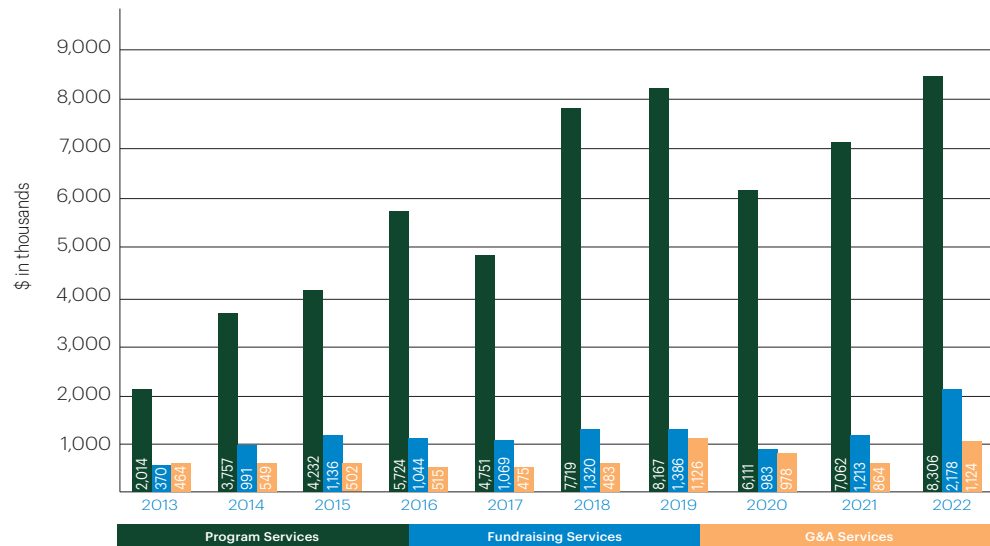
