When National Junior Tennis & Learning (NJTL) opened its doors in four cities in the early 1970's, the founders, who included Arthur Ashe, Charlie Pasarell, and Sheridan Snyder, had a vision to provide access to the sport of tennis for youth in underserved communities. More than 50 years later, their dreams have begun a reality with NJTL chapters operating in 48 states and the District of Columbia.

Message from the Chair and President

Dear Friends,

In 2023, the USTA Foundation continued to pave the way for the future by growing our reach and impact. With your support and dedication to our mission, we were able to serve up dreams for more than 150,000 youth in 250 NJTL chapters.

There were many milestones in 2023. We successfully completed our \$30 million Rally for the Future campaign that helps lift us out of the challenges brought by the pandemic. We awarded an unprecedented \$10.5 million in grants and scholarships to our NJTLs and youth which was nearly a doubling of support awarded in 2022. We established a \$3.3 million USTAF National Court Refurbishment program with the goal of renovating 250 community courts nationwide by 2025. This program will provide opportunities for thousands of people in under-resourced communities nationwide access to the sport of tennis.

It is through the generosity of USTAF's friends and supporters that this organization continues to grow. We raised \$12.59 million to support our mission which will allow us to expand our reach and impact in future years. We are so grateful to our partners and friends for supporting this benchmark and loved seeing you at the Opening Night Gala, Pro-Am, and other events throughout the year.

USTAF will celebrate its 30th anniversary in 2024. We are excited to ring in the next 30 years with lofty goals to serve up even more dreams for youth in under-resourced communities and ensure that these young people have access to courts to play on in their neighborhoods. We will celebrate the groundbreaking of Lulu's Place in Los Angeles, which will become our hub and center for innovation for years to come. Being built in honor of our longtime USTAF Board member, Carol Kimmelman, and in collaboration with Doug Kimmelman, TGR Foundation, and the USTA, Lulu's Place will feature tennis and learning opportunities for youth across Los Angeles. We have so much in store and look forward to working with all of you in our next chapter.

In closing, on behalf of more than 150,000 NJTL scholar-athletes who are achieving new life skills through our programs, thank you to each and every one of our supporters.

Groundbreaking Court Renovations

USTAF launched the USTAF National Court Refurbishment program which will provide up to \$3.3 million to renovate 250 courts nationwide by 2025.

One of the first major grants was made to totally renovate eight Los Angeles City tennis courts located in Harvard Park, which is the home of NJTL chapter Pete Brown Junior Tennis program. Through the National Court Refurbishment program, USTAF is committed to expanding outreach for youth in underserved communities by providing access to quality courts and tennis programs.

"USTAF believes everyone should have access to the sport of tennis, and we work to provide youth with an opportunity to learn and pursue their dreams on and off the court," said Robert Howland, Head of Programs & Social Impact. "We hope everyone in the community will take advantage of playing on these courts. Residents can take advantage of free or low-cost programs offered by the Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks, PlayLA, and the Pete Brown Junior Tennis Program."

The dedication ceremony took place on July 20 and included a special appearance from USTA Foundation supporter Frances Tiafoe, aka "Big Foe", who took part in on-court activities with members of the Pete Brown Junior Tennis Program, PlayLA and the community.

"I am very excited to participate in the dedication of the Harvard Park tennis courts. I had quality courts to play on when I was growing up, and the USTA Foundation's funding of refreshed courts in underresourced communities is very important to me," explained Tiafoe.



USTAF College Scholarships

In 2023, USTAF awarded \$995,000 in scholarship assistance to 49 graduating high school student-athletes. The USTAF provides financial support annually to youth who require financial assistance for college enrollment. All scholarship recipients have participated in USTAF and other organized youth tennis programs, achieved high academic standing, and demonstrated engagement in their communities.

The USTA Foundation in 2023 invited its scholarship recipients to a College Bootcamp to learn from professionals and mentors who are a part of the USTAF family about how to navigate and succeed during their college years This additional support is vital to these student- athletes as many are the first in their families to attend college.

In addition to USTA Foundation scholarships, several NJTL students have received college tennis scholarships and other awards that allowed them to attend college. One such student, Salh Gonzalez from Phoenix After School Sports, received a 2023 Questbridge Scholarship to attend M.I.T. The Questbridge scholarship is a highly competitive award aimed at placing high performing, low-income students in leading colleges and universities. Salh was awarded over \$200,000, and he was joined by past NJTL students, Adilene Valencia (Williams College) and Jason Asenso (Northwestern University) from the East Palo Alto Tennis and Tutoring program as Questbridge scholars.



Novo Nordisk Donnelly Scholarship

The USTA Foundation's Novo Nordisk Donnelly Scholarships are awarded to high-achieving student-athletes who are affected by diabetes. In 2023, two inspirational student-athletes, Chelsea B. and David D, each earned scholarships of \$10,000 and had the opportunity to meet with Billie Jean King at the US Open.

To be considered for selection, student- athletes who are entering a four-year college or university program must complete an application with an essay question about how their life has been affected by diabetes. The funds are intended to support the student's cost of tuition, educational materials, and other related college expenses.



In 2023, the Novo Nordisk Donnelly Coach Grant was awarded to Julie Matheson. Matheson is the assistant coach for the girls' varsity tennis team at Air Academy High School in Colorado Springs, Colo., and teaches youth and adult programming at the Colorado Springs Country Club. Tennis coaches also complete an application with an essay question about how their life has been affected by diabetes while teaching tennis at schools, clubs, and other programs.

These scholarships and grant are named in honor of Tracey Donnelly Maltby and Diane Donnelly Stone, who, along with their father, Bud Donnelly, all played Division I collegiate tennis while affected by the challenges of Type 1 diabetes. First established by King in 1998, the scholarship was associated with the USTA Foundation for the first time in 2021. Novo Nordisk, a global healthcare company that has been making innovative medicines to help people with diabetes for nearly a century, is the title sponsor of the award. The scholarship is also supported by Dexcom, Tandem Diabetes Care, and Cecelia Health.

USTAF Builds for the Future

In October, the USTAF hosted its second annual Impact Conference in Orlando, FL that brought together more than 200 leaders from approximately 80 NJTL chapters nationwide.

The four-day Impact Conference included networking sessions, lectures and workshops in which attendees had the opportunity to learn about nonprofit fundamentals, how to measure and report their organizational impact, the state of education and its effect on NJTL chapters, and how strong sport- based youth development



programs can help equip young people with the tools they need to be successful in the face of adversity. Subject matter experts from Hello Insight, the Search Institute, the Center for Healing & Justice through Sport, and others presented during the event. NJTL chapter leaders also visited the USTA National Campus at Lake Nona for a welcome reception and on-court play.

The USTA Foundation launched the Young Professionals Initiative (YPI) in 2023 to bring together new supporters with fresh perspectives and ideas and to create an active pipeline of future leaders. YPI is a network of successful young professionals who are passionate about tennis and the value of education. YPI engagement highlights included a reception at the new USTA offices in New York City and a US Open gathering. Several YPI members visited local NJTL chapter sites in New York and Los Angeles.



Career Development Programs

Career Week in New York City provided 20 selected Excellence Team players a glimpse into different career paths and demonstrated that there are numerous people from diverse backgrounds they can aspire to become. They received several career development opportunities through panels at ABC Studios and City Hall, including commissioners from the City of NY, FDNY, and a visit from Mayor Adams, presentations from USTA HR on preparing for their career search, and a presentation from H/2 Capital Partners including speed networking.



Excellence Team student-athletes participate in NJTL tennis and education programs nationwide and

are selected for the Excellence program based on criteria including their level of tennis ability, educational outcomes, and commitment to the pathway to matriculate at the collegiate level and potential to compete on the professional tour.

During Career Week, Excellence Team players attended the US Open to watch the women's semifinal matches and to compete in the US Open Excellence Cup presented by American Express, a round-robin tournament held on the grounds of the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center (NTC). While at the NTC during the USTA Foundation Pro-Am, the Excellence Team players and their coaches also had the opportunity to meet and take pictures with tennis legends.



USTAF Launches Frances Tiafoe Fund



Two decades ago, a young Frances Tiafoe got his start in tennis at the Junior Tennis Champions Center (JTCC), an NJTL chapter in College Park, MD. Now having achieved a career high ATP top 10 ranking, Tiafoe is using his platform to give back to the programs that helped shape him.

Tiafoe and USTAF teamed up to launch the Frances Tiafoe Fund to support the USTAF mission to change the lives of under-resourced youth. Tiafoe returned to JTCC to announce the fund and with his usual enthusiasm and smile hosted a tennis clinic for local youth.

"I'm so excited for this opportunity to work with the USTA Foundation and inspire kids who come from my hometown and beyond," Tiafoe said. "I have been thinking about creating a foundation for a long time. One of my priorities has always been to show kids that dreams can come true. I want to tell all the young people who look up to me that it's about the person you are first, and athlete second," Tiafoe continued. "You want to be remembered for who you are, not what you've done."

To celebrate the launch, the USTAF contributed an initial \$150,000 to the establish the fund, and Clif Bar, one of Tiafoe's partners, added a generous grant of \$100,000.

USTAF President Kathleen Wu hailed Tiafoe as a "role model" for youth on and off the court.

The USTA Foundation is a founding supporter of Lulu's Place, a nonprofit youth center in Los Angeles with a mission to open doors to a lifetime of opportunity for youth and families in a safe and encouraging environment.

Today, 80 percent of L.A. Unified students live at or below the poverty line. These students need resources far beyond what they receive in the classroom to ensure they are healthy, active, and reaching their full potential.

Lulu's Place will be an extraordinary campus with top-quality sports, wellness and academic facilities and youth programming. This community hub will transform a 30-acre site north of the Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) that is in close proximity to more than a dozen K-12 schools, the majority of which receive Title 1 funding.







Plans call for 24 tennis courts, eight multi-use courts, four athletic fields, basketball and volleyball courts, a dog park, playground, and picnic area that will be open to the entire community. Lulu's Place will also have a state-of-the-art learning lab which will offer academic support, enrichment classes, college and career preparation, and professional development for educators.

Most importantly, youth programs will be no- or low-cost to ensure all youth and families in need have access to best-in- class coaches, teachers, mentors, and service providers. In December, the project received the last major approval for its lease with Los Angeles World Airports, giving the team the green light to move forward with construction. Groundbreaking is anticipated by summer 2024 with a goal for Lulu's Place to open its doors by 2026.



First Serve - New Mexico Shines

First Serve - New of Santa Fe, N.M. was honored with the NJTL of the Year Award at the 2023 USTA Annual Meeting and Conference for the difference it is making in the life of under-resourced youth in the community. The mission of First Serve - New Mexico is to strengthen the lives and enhance the character of Santa Fe's children through education, life skills and tennis.

First Serve - New Mexico was founded on the belief that providing youth an opportunity to learn and play in a supportive environment can change a child's total trajectory in life. For 20 years, First Serve - New Mexico has provided outstanding programming to Santa Fe youth, and innovative offerings, including virtual tutoring. Smaller on-court player-to-coach ratios

during the COVID-19 pandemic helped the group maintain programming in a time where many other afterschool programs were canceled.

Summer tennis camp attracted more than 160 participants during the pandemic – three times the usual number of attendees – and many were first-time players.

First Serve - New Mexico prides itself on transparent accountability through a detailed reporting system that sets it apart from other organizations. The program keeps quarterly records of how the students are performing in classes, and collects comments from teachers, parents, coaches, and the students to ensure that programming is meeting the needs of the whole child. This diligent system of reporting helps the NJTL provide specialized instruction in the classroom and on the court to develop its scholar-athletes. "We are proud to honor the important work being done at First Serve - New Mexico as they celebrate their 20th anniversary," Craig Morris, Chief Executive, Community Tennis, USTA, said. "The commitment from the leaders of First Serve - New Mexico in delivering programs and resources that emphasize tennis, education and well-being is truly empowering the entire Santa Fe community and helping children reachtheir full potential."

First Serve - New Mexico acknowledged deep gratitude for their founder Eleanor Brenner, who passed in April, 2023, just weeks after the organization was named NJTL of the Year. Brenner and her late husband Dick opened the doors of First Serve - New Mexico in 2003, and under Eleanor's leadership for two decades, First Serve programs changed lives and the community. As her legacy, Eleanor championed and secured generous funding for a permanent tennis and education facility for First Serve - New Mexico.

Chase return the serve

For the past decade, longtime US Open sponsor Chase has provided more than \$1.6 million in grants to National Junior Tennis and Learning (NJTL) chapters nationwide to support their year-round tennis and education programming.

In 2023, 27 NJTL chapters in 14 states were awarded \$325,000 in Chase Return the Serve grants to support the endeavors of more than 54,000 youth from under- resourced communities.

Seven "Return the Serve" Fun Days took place in Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Los Angeles, New York, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. in July with high-energy tennis activities, off-court educational opportunities, and healthy lunch for NJTL participants and their families.

Essay Contest Winners Inspired by Althea Gibson

Ten student-athletes, ages 10 to 18, were selected as the winners of the 24th Annual USTAF NJTL Essay Contest presented by Deloitte. The 10 winners all participate in NJTL chapters nationwide and were selected from more than 1,000 entries.

Students were asked to respond to two questions based on a famous quote from legendary tennis player Althea Gibson, "No matter what accomplishments you make, someone helped you." Students were asked to explain in their own words what this quote meant to them, and were also asked who from NJTL chapter helped them, how did they help, and what impact did it made on their tennis skills and/or life?"

Each winner, along with a parent/legal guardian, won a trip to New York City from August 23-26 during the US Open to participate in various activities, including a tour of Deloitte's New York City office. This educational and immersive experience was led by Deloitte professionals and provided students with activities designed to help them understand the importance of strategic thinking, working with others, and networking.

The student-athletes also had the opportunity to visit the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Queens, the home of the US Open, where they played tennis with Bob and Mike Bryan, the winningest doubles champions in professional tennis history.



The essay contest winners were recognized during remarks at a special luncheon by Janet DeNunzio, Group Brand Director of Sponsorships at Deloitte Services LP, and Michelle Curry from the estate of Althea Gibson.

"These talented students and future leaders exemplify the essence of what the NJTL network is all about," said USTAF Board President Kathleen Wu. "We are grateful to Deloitte for its ongoing support in helping us to provide a truly memorable and valuable experience for this year's essay contest winners and their families."


USTAF Pro-Am at the US Open

influence that tennis has had on their own lives, the sisters took the initiative to establish their own club, called "Tennis 4 Everyone," at their middle and high schools. 


